# 2019 Annual Report











The Geneva Historical Society tells the stories of Geneva, New York. We preserve and interpret these stories through the Geneva History Museum at Prouty-Chew House, Rose Hill Mansion, and Johnston House. 2 story maps were created.

9 **"Looking Back" articles** were written for the Finger Lakes Times.

16 **exhibits** were hosted at the Geneva History Museum and around the community.

50 **blog articles** were written by staff.

118 **partners** helped us to tell Geneva's stories.

44 people and organizations **donated items** to our three-dimensional and archival collections.

297 **research requests** came via email, phone, Facebook, in person, text message and the Historical Society's website.

533 followers on Twitter.

741 people attended **meetings or programs hosted by an outside organization** at the Geneva History Museum.

2,378 students attended **programs held inside and outside classroom**.

3,400 followers on Facebook.

5,791 people attended one of our 43 programs or special events, visited one of our historic house museums, or participated in one of our 19 outreach activities.

Over 8,000 views of the latest **episodes in our video series Geneva's Stories**.

# Fundraising

To generate income the Historical Society relies on a variety of activities including:

Our **Annual Appeal** was held in the early summer and the **Membership** renewal effort began in November.

Our **special events** were Blues, Brews, and BBQ, Rose Hill Food and Wine Celebration, Wassail Bowl and Sale, and trips to Newport, Rhode Island and Letchworth State Park. Our **event sponsors** in 2019 were Bank of the Finger Lakes, C.S. Burrall & Son, Club 86, Eddie O'Briens, Geneva Awning and Tent Works, Geneva Club Beverage, and Phelps Sungas.

Support for our operating costs and programming initiatives came through a combination of **publicly and privately funded grants**. #### Highlights from 2019

We welcomed two **new employees** - Becky Chapin (Archivist) and Amy Pepe (Visitor Services and Public Programs Manager at Rose Hill Mansion and Johnston House).

The **exhibits** Panthers & Saints: High School Sports; Statesmen; Herons, & Lakers: College Sports; Geneva City School District Art Show; A Changing World: Geneva and World War I; and Come Out and Play: Sports in Geneva were held at the Geneva History Museum. There were four displays at the Smith Opera House to celebrate their 125th anniversary, a poster exhibit was created about the Geneva Family YMCA for their capital campaign, and six exhibits were held at the Geneva Public Library.

A **2020-2022 strategic plan** was created and implemented.

Additions to our three-dimensional and archival collections included portraits of Joseph and Persis Tuttle by F.M. Tuttle; archival materials and ephemera from the Geneva Woman's Club, Smith Opera House, and League of Women Voters; and varsity sweater, football windbreaker, basketball practice jersey, boys and girls varsity letters from DeSales High School.

Our planned giving program, **The 1883 Society**, was launched.

While our school programs, summer concerts at Rose Hill and lecture series continued,tours of Brookside and St. Patrick's Cemeteries were given and History Happy Hours were held at Lake Drum Brewing.

The **Cultural Landscape Report** was completed for Rose Hill Mansion.
